Background

On December 9, 2021 a high severity vulnerability (CVE-2021-44228) referred to as Log4j2 was published on GitHub which impacts Apache Log4J and the affected version ranges from 2.0 to 2.14.1. The exploitation of vulnerabilities can cause unauthenticated remote code execution.

Apache Log4J is open source Java code and that is widely used in middleware, development frameworks and web applications to record log information.

Mindray Course of Action

Mindray has not and does not use the identified Log4J in any product sold in North America, so there is no impact on Mindray products
